


## Apartment with a Parisian atmosphere



The owners of this apartment often travel the world and live in different countries for long periods of time. They have two adult sons and a pair of beautiful Bengal cats. The apartment is used by the family during their visits to Moscow, and in the interiors the clients wanted from the very beginning to reflect the atmosphere of Parisian apartments in Ottoman-era mansions.

The details help to recreate the Parisian style in a Moscow apartment: the light palette, neoclassical architectural techniques and designer objects.

The apartment is divided into front and private areas. The front part is a small hallway lined with wooden panels, a bright hallway with stucco, kitchen and living room space separated by a wide archway, and a spectacular guest bathroom. The private area includes bedrooms and a bathroom for the grown children, a hallway with a hidden laundry room and storage, and in the back of the apartment is the parents' bedroom with a separate bath, walk-in closet and small loggia.

"A large irregularly shaped sofa in the living room, an antique French fireplace over which a mirrored bar is hidden, a gentle arch and elegant moldings - all this creates an atmosphere of elegance, chic and at the same time invites you to relax in a family circle or friendly company," says the designer.



" The typical style of the Parisian apartments combines classic architectural techniques and elements with modern designer furniture and lighting, giving a sharp ideological and stylistic contrast. This contrast is softened by the light palette, which makes the space look like an airy cocoon. The use of natural materials and the chosen textiles bring textural variety to the interiors", says designer Lika Arten about the project.



"The project is both elegant and relaxed. It seems to me that this is a topical combination. And it is certainly important that, as the customers said, it was a 100% hit."




